Coronavirus on the estate

Boat Launching and Canada Geese

We have a perennial problem with Canada Geese. Well we live by the river so we would have, but they make a mess on the hard and if left to go their merry way, ruin the enjoyment of it for all of us. So, that is why we have netted off the river frontage and jetty as they like to land on water then hop up onto the hard to mess it up.

This netting approach has worked well so far. However, a couple of Geese seem to have been to night school and worked out how to mount the jetty, then hop over on to the hard. We don't want that, so have rearranged the netting around the jetty to stop them.

What we would really like now and for the greater good is for anyone launching a boat or returning by boat to use the slipway NOT the jetty, as has been evidenced recently.

Bin Collections

RBWM have advised that for the duration of the 'Lockdown' the weekly collection will only apply to our Communal bins. The bins of individual houses on the Estate will be collected fortnightly – refuse and recycling on alternative weeks. It is likely that the bins may become over-full. Please ensure you fold-down all cardboard boxes before placing them in the recycling bins. This will release much needed extra space. All shredded paper should be placed in a plastic bag before depositing in the recycling bin.

If necessary, additional refuse and re-cycling can be placed in sealed bags and placed alongside the bins on collection day. RBWM no longer provide these bags, but you can purchase them from Amazon on-line
